Good afternoon and welcome to our bulletin Newsletter.

Last Monday the teaching started the half term with an INSET day at Allenbourn Middle School in collaboration with our other Initio Learning Trust middle school colleagues. In the morning our focus was on effective techniques to check for understanding so that we know how to move learning forward for our pupils. In the afternoon we then moved into subject teams to complete further work on our curriculum and retrieval practice. Retrieval practice is the strategic revisiting of prior learning to ensure it is retained to be built on at a later date.

Mental Health Support Team (MHST)

Earlier this term, Mrs Whittaker shared some information about our MHST and shared a questionnaire regarding their service. Thank you for your responses. Feedback from parents/carers identified that they would like to know more about the service and how to refer into the MHST. Below is a response from MHST themselves.



Mental Health Support Teams (MHST) in schools are part of a joint national initiative between the Department of Education and NHS England to improve access to psychological therapies (IAPT) for children and young people presenting with emerging low mood and mild to moderate anxiety within an educational environment.

The 3 core functions of the teams are:

- Delivering evidence-based interventions for mild to moderate mental health issues through individual face-to-face work and group work for students or parents.
- Supporting the school's Designated Mental Health Lead to introduce, or develop, their Whole School Approach to emotional wellbeing.
- Giving timely advice to school and college staff, and liaising with external specialist services, to help children and young people to get the right support.

Education Mental Health Practitioners (EMHPs) work as part of the MHST in schools delivering 1:1 work with young people and/or their families. EMHPs also deliver workshops in schools to whole classes and run groups for young people and groups for parents/carers. EMHPs are the people your children are most likely to see in school.

Please speak to your child's Tutor or Head of Year or a member of the School Leadership Team if you feel you would benefit from support from the MHST.
