

## Lockyer's Middle School –Year 7 and 8 Careers Programme 2025-2026

### Next Evaluation: Autumn 2026

All our pupils have access to a careers programme aimed at challenging stereotypes, broadening horizons and developing a sound understanding of the pathways open to them in the future.

In **Years 5 and 6**, students consider different jobs which link to the different curriculum areas and real-life links to learning. Students attend a range of assemblies which focus on challenging stereotypes, inspiring individuals, and developing aspiration.

- PSHE: Year 5 Dreams and Goals Unit (looking at different jobs, links to earnings, considering what motivates people and reflecting on the dreams and goals of young people in a culture different from our own).
- PSHE: Year 6 Money Matters (Managing personal finance and earnings)

Students in **Years 7 and 8** complete the following programme of careers advice and support in a 25 minute tutor group session every other week. Plans for each of these sessions can be viewed separately. This programme is taught by class tutors and planned and monitored by the Head of Year 8 who is the school's Careers Leader.

**In addition to this programme students will participate in at least one meaningful encounter with an employer; at least one of these encounters will be with a STEM employer or workplace.**

In 2025 – 2026 these encounters will include:

- a. Careers events such as careers talks, visiting speakers, careers carousels and careers fairs.
- b. Further Education events such as talks from FE providers and visits to local universities
- c. Business games and enterprise competitions.
- d. Onsite careers discussions during residential visits

### **Careers in Context**

The NHS is the largest single employer in Dorset, covering a significant portion of job vacancies and demand in the area.

The fastest-growing employment sectors are heavily driven by technology, sustainability, and healthcare demands. Key sectors include Information Technology (IT), particularly with AI and cybersecurity roles; Green Energy and Sustainability, focusing on renewable energy and climate-related strategies; and Healthcare, due to an aging population and increased focus on well-being.
